



PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Each player, coach or parent will need to obtain a Passport and Visa in order to travel to Brazil.

Follow the following steps:

1. Obtain a passport.

Applications can be picked up at your local post office and U.S. clerical courts. Most countries require travelers to have a passport that is valid more than 90 days after your trip return date. **Apply for a passport. Process usually takes about 30 days.**

2. Get a Tourist Visa.

Contact the Brazilian Consulate that pertains to your area. Obtain Visa application and fee information from the consulate of your jurisdiction. **You must request a TOURIST Visa. The purpose of your trip is PARTICIPATION IN UNPAID ATHLETIC EVENTS.**

An Invitation Letter must be attached to your visa application. C.F.F.B will provide this letter. Please contact quinho@cffb.com.br for a letter.

Players under 18 years of age must return the Travel Authorization Form, signed by either parents or legal guardians and notarized, to the Consulate and send a copy to the C.F.F.B office.

With your completed application you will need to send:

(1) Two 2"x2" photos - white or off-white background, front view, full face, must

be a recent photo

(2) Appropriate fees

(3) Valid passport (not expiring in less than 6 months)

(4) Copy of airline itinerary

(5) Letter of Invitation provided by Delima Soccer

(6) Travel Authorization Form

* Return the application package to the Consulate either in person or by mail.

* Passport and Visa are returned to the applicant either by mail or can be picked up in person at the Consulate.

VISA EXEMPTIONS

Citizens of the following countries do not need visas when traveling to Brazil for tourism purposes for a period of up to 90 days:

3. Additional Notes

For those living in the NY Consulate jurisdiction (states of CT, DE, NJ, NY, PA, and the Bermuda Islands), the NY Consulate only accepts visa applications in person. DSE suggests using VIP Services, phone # 1-800-856-8472.

Additional information and extra fees may apply depending on the specific details of your trip. Be sure to check directly with the Brazilian Consulate where you will be applying for a visa for application fees. Once all the requirements have been met, visas are normally processed in:

- ◆ 5 business days when visa application is presented personally or by a third person acting on behalf of the applicant;
- ◆ 7 business days when visa application is presented by a travel/visa agency, and;
- ◆ 10 business days when visa application is received by mail.
